

# Q1 What language would you like to take this survey in?





## Q7 Is the existing DAC conveniently located for you (central Austin, south of Lady Bird Lake)?







## Q15 What would be the benefits you see to a shared DAC/AISD facility? (Check all that apply)







It leads to expense of money and area to construct large, opulent foyers and common spaces. Given the shortage of space and construction financing for the DAC's various programs, I think you should tilt toward more purpose-driven spaces than those that invite welcoming and lounging. In general, there is no need for opulence in a facility with the DAC's mission. Keep it practical and use this opportunity to most effectively support your program needs. 2) A prominent local gallery owner told me of his and others' reservations about displaying local artists' work. The root reason for this is that the local art market is prominantly dominated by artist's direct sales opportunities like EAST, WEST, Blue Genie, the Armadillo Bazaar, and other such outlets. Art buyers like this for three very good reasons: a) They like having a personal connection to the artist. b) Prices for artwork are not burdened by gallery commissions, which typically double sales prices. c) Austin's buyers are independent-minded in their taste. They have plenty of opportunities to discover the local artists they like and are less needy or inclined than buyers in most cities to have their favorite gallery owner curate their taste for them. For all these reasons, some of the best galleries plausibly tilt toward showing the work of out-of-town artists. This is a good thing, in that it broadens the horizons of the local market. But the downside is that it results in a lack of gallery-style display opportunities for local artists. The City does a good job with providing such opportunities through the DAC and Old Bakery. But there is a need for more. I hope that the new DAC can provide more of these opportunities. 

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
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

### Q23 How would you identify your race/ethnicity?


