Owning a car represents 22% of their income, which is a necessary expense in the state that could disqualify them of SNAP access. Although 93.9% of Austin households have at least one vehicle, the burden of vehicle ownership and maintenance could negatively impact a household's food budget and jeopardize their elgibility to recieve SNAP benefits.
