### What do inspectors look for?

Every building has a foundation. A foundation is a big block of concrete that holds the building. A solid foundation means that the building can stand strong and safe, but a broken, cracked or damaged foundation could mean danger to those who live in the building. Inspectors look for damaged foundations so that they can be fixed and people can live safe in the buildings they hold.

Code inspectors make sure that all doors and windows open easily so that in case of an emergency, you are able to get out!


#### WATER LEAKS



### What do inspectors look for?

Inspectors look for water leaks because they could point out broken pipes. Why is this important? Well, if a broken pipe is not addressed it could lead to water leaking under the floor which could damage floors and furniture. Some times water leaks lead to mold (fuzzy-looking dirt) that could cause allergies. Keeping an eye on leaks is important to keep you dry & allergy-free!
